

1900's Airplane

Supplies

- toilet paper rolls. 1 roll for each airplane
- 2 large and 2 mini craft sticks per airplane
- tempura paint and brushes
- two paper plates (at least)
- hot glue and hot glue gun
- scissors and x-acto knife
- 1 pony bead, 1 black or gray pipe cleaner, 2 mini black pompoms per airplane
- small piece of craft foam to match the color of each airplane wing



Instructions

1. Paint a few coats on each of the toilet paper rolls, on each set of wings, and craft sticks for the propeller. Let all dry.
2. Hot glue the end of the toilet paper roll to make the airplane nose.
3. For the wings, apply a thin line of hot glue across the middle-top of the toilet paper roll and then press one of the large craft stick into the glue. Turn the toilet paper roll over and do the same thing to the middle-bottom of the toilet paper roll. Try to line up the craft sticks so that the wings are lined up.
4. For the propeller, glue the mini craft sticks to form an 'X' and add the pony bead. Glue the propeller on the end of the sealed toilet paper side.
5. Draw and cut a fin shape onto the craft foam sheet that matches the color of the wings and propeller. Use the x-acto knife to cut a 2-3" notch into the top back end of the toilet paper roll (airplane) to slide the fin in.
6. For the landing gear, cut two small pieces of black pipe cleaner, add a pompom for a wheel. Glue to the bottom of the plane.
