

# Cardboard Medieval Castle


## Supplies

- three empty paper towel rolls
- four pieces of cardboard
- construction paper
- black marker
- hot glue gun and hot glue (Adult help needed)
- scissors



## Instructions

1. Cut two empty paper towel rolls in half. to make the four corners of the castle. Leave the third paper towel roll as is.
2. Use the black marker to draw stones on the four pillars. Draw lines all around the tube, then just create bricks all around those lines.
3. On one end of each of the four pillars, cut out rectangles, and draw windows on each of the four pillars.
4. Cut two squares and two rectangles out of the cardboard pieces. You want these pieces to be a bit smaller than your pillars when you line them up against each other.
5. Use your black marker again and draw smaller bricks on the walls. To make sure the bricks line up on each side you can match them by placing them side by side. Cut out windows in three of the cardboard walls. Create a door in the fourth one.
6. Glue the four walls, to your four pillars as illustrated up above.
7. With the third paper towel roll, create a tower by drawing bricks. Create a cone shape out of construction paper and glue it on the top.
